United Way Oxford is committed to investing for impact and making the best decisions we can with the dollars that donors entrust to us. We strive to address areas of immediate needs and to look to change social conditions that will address root causes.

This past year we entered into the second round of our 3-year funding cycle using our new Investment Framework. Using lessons learned over the last few years, our Community Impact Investment Council volunteers reviewed statements of interest, and then full applications, from agencies across Oxford County who are aligned with our investment strategies and looking to support people as they strive for a better tomorrow. The process started in September and wrapped up at the end of February. For the 25+ active volunteers who are willing to share their knowledge it is intense, interesting and extremely rewarding work. Together, they contributed almost 900 hours towards making the most strategic funding decisions designed to have the best impact; it is not easy work! We are so grateful for their belief in and commitment to our efforts.

This past year, our volunteers and staff spent many hours hosting community conversations designed to ensure that United Way truly understands the needs in our community. We gathered people from across the County, and from all backgrounds, ages and walksof-life, and listened as they spoke of what mattered to them, what their aspirations were and how we could create a community that met their expectations. People really want similar things - they want a community where everyone's basic needs are met, where everyone has a sense of belonging, and where there are supports and services for those that need them. The full report, in the form of Community Narratives, will be released later in 2019. Not only will it guide our work at United Way, but we are confident that many other organizations will find the information useful and help deepen their understanding of our community.

As the Chair of the Community Impact Investment Council I also see how United Way continues to work with other community organizations so that we can invest, collaborate, support, mobilize, advocate and partner to best meet the needs of Oxford County residents. In this way, we all work together in the community to show our local care and concern.

This is why United Way invests in programs that have a wide range of impact. The Leadership Challenge Grant was launched in 2017 through the generosity and guidance of Dennis and Joan Vollmershausen, and continued through the 2018 campaign. The sponsored Employee Program is a unique professional development opportunity in which a company loans an employee to United Way Oxford for a 16 week period during our annual fall campaign. With training in fundraising techniques and the support of United Way staff, the sponsored employee assists in every aspect of our community efforts. With guidance, participants provide individualized support to over 150 workplace campaigns in Oxford County, helping

to keep costs low. In 2018, United Way Oxford was given the opportunity to work with Kennedy Atkinson from GM Canada CAMI Assembly Plant/Unifor Local 88. Kennedy was instrumental in the success of our campaign. She assisted with special events, participated in presentations, provided support to our workplace champions and clocked countless kilometres as she travelled throughout the county.

I am very grateful to GM CAMI Assembly Plant and UNIFOR Local 88 for their belief and commitment to United Way Oxford and their support of the Sponsored Employee program. My time as a Sponsored Employee at United Way Oxford came at a crossroads in my life. I needed to hit the reset button and that's exactly what United Way allowed me to do. 2018/19 youth united


